BOOKING CONDITIONS:100% of reservation fee must be paid at time of booking to secure spot.

CANCELLATIONS: If you need to cancel your trip for any reason, fees charged will be determined by the number of days between your notification of the museum of your cancellation and the trip departure date : Cancellations received greater than 90 days : Full refund less \$50.00 administration fee, 60 to 90 days : 50 % of payment refunded *, 30 to 60 days : 25% of payment refunded *, Less than 30 days : NO REFUND. All cancellations must be received in writing. * If we have the minimum number of participants and are able to fill your berth on the voyage, you will receive a full refund less the \$50 administration fee.

RESPONSIBILITIES: The Maritime Museum of San Diego (including, for the purpose of this paragraph, its employees, agents, suppliers, contractors, and any person or company associated with the planning and/or execution of your trip) hereby notifies you, as a traveler, that all tickets or vouchers issued to you for transportation, conveyance, hotel accommodations, or tours are made for you on the express condition that the Maritime Museum of San Diego shall not be liable or responsible for any injury, damage, liability, loss, accident, delay, expense or irregularity which results from any of the following: (a) any defect in any vehicle or other mode of transportation; (b) any act or omission of any person or entity engaged in conveying passengers or providing lodging or tour activities, including the acts or omissions of any agent, employee or contractor of any such person or entity; (c) any act or omission of any other person or entity engaged in carrying out the arrangements of the tour. The Maritime Museum of San Diego shall not be liable or responsible for any injury, damage, liability, loss, accident, delay, expense or irregularity which results from (i) delays or changes in schedule or itineraries; (ii) hotel over-booking; (iii) failures of others to perform obligations for the benefit of the Maritime Museum of San Diego or its tour participants; (iv) injury, sickness or ill health; (v) weather or action of the elements; (vi) strikes; (vii) civil disobedience, riot or war; (viii) quarantine; or (ix) other events or occurrences beyond the direct control of the Maritime Museum of San Diego. By confirming your reservation and participating in the tour, you assume any and all risk of any and all injury, damage, liability, loss, accident, delay, expense or irregularity which may result from any or all of the events or occurrences described in this paragraph. We retain the right to not accept or retain any individual whose actions, conduct or physical or mental condition is determined by the Maritime Museum of San Diego's absolute and unfettered discretion, to be detrimental or incompatible with the safety, interest, comfort, harmony or well-being of any tour group as a whole. As a tour participant, you are responsible for your own baggage (and its contents) and other items throughout the entire trip, and any loss or damage are at your own risk. The Maritime Museum of San Diego shall not be liable or responsible for any injury, damage, or loss of baggage (or any contents); or for any injury, damage, liability or loss resulting from injury, damage, or loss of baggage (or any contents). Your paying a deposit, or any partial or full payment of a reservation, shall constitute your accepting all of the terms and conditions set forth herein.

<u>HEALTH & FITNESS</u>: I acknowledge that I am joining an active trip, and I represent and warrant that I have no knowledge of any physical, emotional or other condition or disability which may create a hazard to myself or any other tour participants. I am not under the influence of drugs and am sufficiently qualified, trained and capable to participate in these activities. Therefore, I assume full responsibility for myself, including any minor children for which I am responsible, for bodily injury, accidents, illness, death, loss of personal property, and expenses as a result of any accident which may occur. I hereby authorize any medical treatment deemed necessary in the event of an injury while participating in the activity. I have either appropriate insurance, or in its absence, agree to pay all costs of rescue and/or medical services as may be incur on my behalf. I also agree to wear life saving equipment when necessary for the specific activity.

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Code of Conduct

Participation in this sailing program or its activities implies familiarity and agreement with the following rules of conduct for the duration of the voyage. Failure to comply with these rules will result in dismissal from the ship's company at the Captain's discretion at the first available port. Transportation home from point of dismissal will be at the participant's own expense. No refunds will be provided for partially competed voyages.

The rules of the ship are as follows:

- Personal firearms, alcohol, and illegal drugs are not allowed on board at any time.
- All prescription drugs brought on board must be indicated on your medical form.
- Any medical condition affecting safety or performance of your duties must be brought to the attention of the Captain before signing on board.
- Everyone is expected to perform duties consistent with their experience and as assigned by the ship's officers.
- Inappropriate behavior consists of:
 - Use of foul or insulting language.
 - Lack of consideration or respect towards shipmates.
 - Unsafe practices or failing to obtain permission for regulated activities. (Swimming, use of shore boats, laying aloft, firing cannon)
 - Lack of consideration for ship's property and property of shipmates.

Smoking Policy:

The greatest danger facing a wooden ship is fire. For that reason, there is no smoking on board.

What to bring on a multi-day voyage:

Space is very limited shipboard. All of your gear will need to fit in an open storage bin that measures 1.5 ft. 2 ft or be kept in your sleeping berth. Please keep this in mind while you are packing!

- 1 soft duffel bag and/or a daypack for all your gear, **no suitcases!** (at the least, a plastic bag makes a good container)
- Sleeping Bag, pillow, sleeping mat, and sheet, plus an extra sheet for a privacy curtain.
- Layers of clothing. Pack sparingly, and keep in mind that it is most often 15 to 20 cooler than shore temperatures. Ships work is often dirty and destructive to clothes you probably only need one "nice" out fit for going to shore.
- Wool sweater
- Long underwear
- A ski hat is a must.
- Two pairs of comfortable shoes (make sure one is closed toe hiking style and has good traction)
- Sun Hat (make sure you have something that you can keep from blowing off)
- Sunscreen
- Good Sunglasses and maybe an extra pair (a strap is a good idea)
- Towel
- Flashlight or Headlamp for personal reading. Headlamp is best in a moving bunk.(Red lens required for use on deck after dark.)
- Coffee/Thermal Travel Mug with a wide base/ non-breakable
- Ear plugs
- Toiletry Kit
- Extra pair prescription eyewear (if applicable)
- Sea sick medication (If you feel you need it, begin taking 24hrs prior to departure.)

Optional

- Rain Suit or Foul Weather Gear. (At night, on watch, with spray coming over the side, you will get wet and cold, if nothing else this will cut the wind. Both pants and coat are recommended.)
- Sailing gloves (without fingertips) can be helpful for pulling line.
- Knife on belt or lanyard. The sail training will teach you the usefulness of this.
- Binoculars if you already own them.
- Baby wipes or whatever cleaning wipes to freshen-up with.
- Bathing Suit
- Camera
- Table cloth size piece of cloth to make a privacy curtain for your bunk
- Eye mask for sleeping
- Water bottle
- Handkerchief
- Backup ear plugs
- · Folding beach chair



General information for passengers aboard San Salvador

Meals: Meals and snacks will be provided on the boat. The San Salvador has a cook aboard, but please note that supplies are limited and some dietary restrictions may be beyond our ability to meet. If you have dietary restrictions, please make special note on your medical form. When at a harbor during a mealtime, you may desire to purchase meals on shore. Fresh water is limited; participants are welcome to bring up to one 6 pack of bottled water for their own consumption. For your convenience and use, please bring your own coffee mug. Both meals and cleaning are communal activities.

Showers and Laundry: While at a harbor, we will try to have available the use of the showers on shore. Often there is a coin laundry available in such situations. You can wash your hair on deck with salt water if you choose. Bring layers of clothing for all weather situations but do not expect to wear clean clothes all the time nor shower every day. The crew recommends baby wipes as a nice way to stay fresh without a shower.

Berths: The bunks aboard the San Salvador are thickly padded and vinyl covered. While they do have accommodations for privacy curtains, they are in communal spaces. Bunk assignment is at random with the exception of persons with special needs. You must provide your own bedding supplies. Electricity: The boat has batteries at 12v and a generator that runs when the motor is running that can give 110v. Access to electrical outlets is not easy, but will be normally available to people who want to charge batteries on computers or cameras. Note that not everyone will have access to electricity at any time they would like.

Cell Phone/ CDs/walkmans: Part of the experience of a sailboat at sea is its isolation and shipboard community. On the other hand, used sparingly there is no problem with bringing a cell phone. Note that your phone may not work well even when close to shore.

Smoking Policy: The greatest danger facing a wooden ship is fire. For that reason, there is NO SMOKING on board.

Seasickness: Take precautions to prevent seasickness! Nobody should think that they simply don't get seasick. There are several wristband technologies, though for most people medication (Dramamine, Bonine, or other over the counter brand) may be more reliable. The active ingredient in Bonine can be purchased from your pharmacist for a fraction of the brand name. Ask them for guidance on interaction issues with your prescriptions.

Alcohol, Illegal Drugs, and Inappropriate Behavior: While on board the San Salvador all laws and regulations of the U.S. as they pertain to passenger vessels apply. The Captain can dismiss any participant from the trip for violations of the conduct code. Such a participant can be dropped off at any port and be expected to find his or her own way back home. The cost of the trip is not refunded. See Code of Conduct in the application package.

Cancellation Policy: To reserve a berth requires full payment. If you need to cancel 60 days before the date of the program, you will receive a full refund. If you cancel 30 days before the date of the program you will receive 50% refund. Cancellations less than 30 days before the date of the program will result in the forfeiture of the entire sum of the trip. If the scheduled program is cancelled by the Maritime Museum for any reason, you will receive a full refund for any monies pre-paid. All travel and hotel arrangements made by you are your responsibility. We recommend you seek travel insurance for your logistics'.

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
